## Background

On September 1, 2013, the Hidalgo County Regional Mobility Authority (HCRMA) was authorized by House Bill 474 to establish an overweight and oversized truck corridor, as well as, issue permits for use of the corridor. The legislation allows the HCRMA to charge a set permit fee with $85 \%$ of the fee reserved for construction and maintenance of the corridor and the remaining $15 \%$ going to the HCRMA for administrative costs.

## Goal

Texas Transportation Code 623 Subchapter S provides that The Texas Department of Transportation may authorize the Authority to issue permits for the movement of oversize or overweight vehicles carrying cargo on certain roads in Hidalgo County and allows for other routes designated by the commission in consultation with the authority to be added to the overweight corridor. The proposed routes to be added are:

Doffin Road from Spur 29 to US 281/Military highway.
Border Safety Inspection Facility Connector Road from Spur 29 to US 281/Military Highway

## Options

The Board of Directors may disapprove the proposed amendment to the overweight/oversized corridor.

## Recommendation

Based on review by this office, approval of Resolution 2024-15 - Approval of amendment to the Hidalgo County Regional Mobility Authority Overweight/Oversized Vehicle Permit Corridor is recommended as presented.

## CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL TO DESIGNATE ADDITIONAL ROUTES TO THE HIDALGO COUNTY OVERWEIGHT AND OVERSIZED VEHICLE CORRIDOR

THIS RESOLUTION is adopted this $5^{\text {th }}$ day of March, 2024, by the Board of Directors of the Hidalgo County Regional Mobility Authority.

WHEREAS, the Hidalgo County Regional Mobility Authority (the "Authority"), acting through its Board of Directors (the "Board"), is a regional mobility authority created pursuant to Chapter 370, Texas Transportation Code, as amended (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2005, the Texas Transportation Commission (the "Commission") created the Authority pursuant to (i) the Act; (ii) Title 43, Texas Administrative Code; (iii) a petition of the Hidalgo County Commissioners Court (the "County"); and (iv) findings by the Commission that the creation of the Authority would result in certain direct benefits to the State of Texas (the "State"), local governments, and the traveling public and would improve the State's transportation system; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Transportation Code 623 Subchapter S provides that the Texas Department of Transportation (the "Department') may authorize the Authority to issue permits for the movement of oversize or overweight vehicles carrying cargo on certain roads in Hidalgo County; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Transportation Code 623 Subchapter S also allows for other routes designated by the Transportation commission, in consultation with the authority, to be added to the overweight corridor; and

WHEREAS, the Department has adopted rules prescribing procedures for issuing permits for the movement of oversize and overweight vehicles in Chapter 28 of Title 43 of the Texas Administration Code and has published rules authorizing the Authority to issue such permits and prescribing procedures for the same; and

WHEREAS, oversize and overweight vehicles have a unique commercial purpose but also cause considerable wear and tear on roadways requiring additional maintenance, repair and reconstruction; and

WHEREAS, the issuance of permits for such oversize and overweight vehicles for travel on restricted corridors creates a revenue stream to offset the increased maintenance expenses for such roadways; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds it to be in the best interest of the Authority and the County to designate additional routes for the issuance of oversize and overweight permits, the collection of fees, and the maintenance of the roadways located in certain oversize and overweight corridors.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Hidalgo County Regional Mobility Authority that:

Section 1. The recital clauses are incorporated in the text of this Resolution as if fully restated.

Section 2. The Board hereby approves the additional routes relating to the permitting of oversize and overweight vehicles carrying cargo on certain roadways in the County, attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Section 3. The Board hereby authorizes the Executive Director to submit the additional routes to the Texas Department of Transportation for consideration by the Texas Transportation Commission.

Dear Mr. Rodriguez,
The Pharr International Bridge is located in Hidalgo County in the Rio Grande Valley (RGV), along the Texas/Mexico border, with an estimated population of 80,000 residents in the fourth fastest-growing region in Texas. The Pharr International Bridge is the only full-service commercial port of entry located in the RGV.

Currently, the Pharr International Bridge ranks third in the nation for trade with Mexico, seventh as the largest and fastest-growing land port of entry nationally and first as the number one crosser of produce in the nation.

The Pharr International Bridge serves as an international gateway to the United States for both commercial and vehicular crossings. The Pharr International Bridge is 1st in oil and gas exports, 1st in trade for automotive, technology, oil and gas, perishables and construction sectors, and 1st in produce imports with $65 \%$ of the nation's imports.

The City of Pharr is in an active effort to improve the flow of commercial traffic both North and South bound from the Pharr International Bridge and has contracted with private entities to operate and maintain an industrial commercial truck yard on City owned property South of the levee on Doffing Rd. Doffing Rd. is owned and operated by the City of Pharr and as per Texas Transportation Code section 621.303, the City of Pharr has the authority to regulate commercial traffic on its roads.

On or about February 16, 2024, an application for the Texas Department of Agriculture certified commercial scale was filed with the HCRMA seeking certification. Although Doffing Rd. is not an overweight route, it directly connects to the HCRMA overweight route between sections nine (9) and eight (8) as shown as Exhibit A (in Appendix). It is on that basis that the City of Pharr respectfully requests that the aforementioned HCRMA application be approved, as the City has contracted with the applicant to maintain and use Doffing Rd. as overweight Route to connect to the HCRMA overweight route previously mentioned.

As the region grows by leaps and bounds it is imperative that we work together to find solutions to our commercial traffic congestion. The approval of the subject application will not only serve to help alleviate said congestion, and improve safety, but also generate revenue for the HCRMA through the issuance of overweight permits.
